



Community Builders Workshop (Citizenship and British Values)

Lesson Outcomes:

1. To know what a community is
2. To describe what a community needs
3. To be able to explain the needs of a community and why these things are important

About:

The focus of the workshop is to teach students about the importance of living in our British community. They will be asked to build a community which shows our national identity by building places of worship, sustainable development; it needs to reflect our values and customs and show how they can support others. As well as this students will be challenged to be inclusive of others through mutual respect by team building.

National Curriculum Links:

KS1

-Students will learn to play, work as a team, show responsibility and care for others as well as respecting other people's needs and beliefs. We will also include British values and encourage students to adapt these when working together to devise their own community.

-Students will learn how communities grow, change and evolve and focus them on the wider world. This workshop will ask them to explore how justice is served and ask if they can improve the way justice is served. They will focus on how their community helps others and compare this to other students work to see who has helped local citizens. As well as this we want students to include all their community and offer support networks.

Differentiation:

1. If students can be allocated groups before my arrival which reflect mixed ability groups
